Neighborhood Restoration Goals and Objectives



NEIGHBORHOOD RESTORATION focuses on improving and revitalizing the economic and social conditions of the target neighborhoods through strategies that aim to:

- Improve living conditions
- Enhance home safety
- Allow for low cost physical improvements
- Develop long term efforts to renovate and maintain housing
- Provide educational, social, recreational and economic opportunities
- Foster self-worth and individual responsibility among community members.

<u>Goal #1</u>: Improve the home environment to promote and support safe, decent and sanitary housing that protects from disease and injury.

Objectives:

✓ Connect residents to local programs that will assist in the assessment and development of healthy homes.

Project examples: Lead Program, Asthma Program (grant-funded \$28,000.00), smoke-free housing (grant-funded \$2,500.00), Center City Disease Prevention project (CIP-funded \$20,000.00)

<u>Goal #2</u>: Revitalize and develop green space for Manchester residents within the target neighborhoods.

Objectives:

- ✓ Improve the physical appearance and attractiveness of key neighborhood destinations.
 - Project examples: Planters, Graffiti Clean-ups, Rails to Trails
- ✓ Increase accessibility and connectivity of key community resources/services within neighborhoods. Project example: Skate Park Walkway

<u>Goal #3</u>: Develop livable-walkable neighborhoods to improve quality of life and strengthen connections to key community resources.

Objectives:

✓ Improve the physical environment and safety within neighborhoods to increase walkability.

Project examples: Safe Routes to School (grant-funded \$15,000.00; pending \$194,000.00), HEAL Innovation Fund Project (grant-funded \$90,000.00)

<u>Goal #4</u>: Improve neighborhood safety and crime within the target neighborhoods.

Objectives:

✓ Provide Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) trainings and technical assistance for local businesses and residents. Project examples: CPTED training for Neighborhood Watch Captains,

- Advanced CPTED Training for Local Business (technical assistance from National Crime Prevention Association)
- ✓ Develop neighborhood-specific plans to implement CPTED principles.

<u>Goal #5</u>: Promote and advocate for opportunities that foster financial self sufficiency, leadership development and connectivity to key community resources for Manchester residents.

Objectives:

- ✓ Increase awareness of the services and resources related to financial literacy and assistance that are available within Manchester.
 Project example: Unemployment Guide to Community Resources
- ✓ Promote easily accessible tax assistance services through VITA.
- ✓ Provide leadership development and skill building opportunities for Manchester residents.
 - Project example: Resident Leadership Development Training
- ✓ Strengthen collective efficacy within the target neighborhoods.

 Project example: Neighborhood Block Party sponsored by Amoskeag
 Urgent Dental Care (\$2,000.00) and CIP-funding (\$1,000.00).
