

Sidewalks under consideration this year will be mostly on Central and South Roads. As always we will continue to upgrade our sidewalk system.

It is recommended that a Master Plan be updated every five years. We did our original one in 1986 and it has not been updated since. It will be underway shortly and hopefully, a grant from the Office of State Planning will be forthcoming.

Then came November and a huge snowstorm that fell on all the unraked leaves in the Precinct. In case you don't know, they are still buried under more than three feet of snow! District Warrant State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of Rye Beach Village District, a Village District in the Town of Rye, organized under the provisions of Chapter 195, Sessions Law of 1905, amended in 1937 and 1943, qualified to vote in District affairs:

You are hereby notified that the annual meeting of the Rye Beach District will be held at the Precinct Building in said District on Tuesday, the 8th of April 2003, at seven-thirty o'clock in the evening, to act upon the following matters:

- **Article 1.** To elect a Moderator for the ensuing year.
- **Article 2.** To elect a District Clerk for the ensuing year.
- Article 3. To hear reports of the Treasurer, Auditor, Committees or Officers heretofore chosen, and pass any votes relating thereto.
- Article 4. To elect a Commissioner for three years, a Treasurer and an Auditor for the ensuing year.
- Article 5. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for District charges for the ensuing year.
- Article 6. To authorize the District Officers to raise money by District note in anticipation of taxes.
- Article 7. To see if the District will vote to authorize the Commissioners to apply for, receive and expend Federal and State grants which may become available during the course of the year, in accordance with RSA31:95-b, and also to accept and expend money from any other governmental unit or private source to be used for purposes for which the District may legally appropriate money.
- Article 8. To see if the District will vote to amend the Rye Beach zoning map and zoning ordinance, proposed by the Rye Beach Village District Commissioners, as follows: Expand the recreational district (RCR) by rezoning to Recreational that portion of the land area presently zoned for Low Density Residential (LDR) use which is shown approximately as Lots 45 and 56 on Tax Map 4 and specifically shown as Tracts 2 and 3 on a plan titled "Boundary Compilation Plan South Road, Central Road and Spruce Lane, Rye Beach New Hampshire for Abenaqui Country Club, Inc." (Recommended by the Rye Beach Planning Board) (Ballot Vote required).

Minutes of the Rye Beach Precinct Meeting April 9, 2002

The Rye Beach Precinct meeting was called to order at 7:38 p.m. on Tuesday, April 9, 2002 by acting Moderator Al Casassa. Elected Moderator Sharon DeVries stepped down because of a new legal ruling.

- Article 1: Al Casassa was nominated as our new moderator for the ensuing year. Motion was M/S/P.
- **Article 2:** Joan Gittlein was nominated as District Clerk for the ensuing year. Motion was M/S/P.
- Article 3: Motion was made by Sharon DeVries to dispense with the reading of reports from Treasurer, Auditor, Committees or Officers heretofore chosen and to approve reports as given in the Annual Report. Motion was M/S/P.
- **Article 4:** Frank Drake was nominated for Commissioner for a three-year term. Motion was M/S/P.

Tyson Dines was nominated as Treasurer. Motion was M/S/P.

Andrew Mahoney was nominated as Auditor. Motion was M/S/P.

- Article 5: After discussion a motion was made to designate the District Commissioners as agents to expend the exisiting Capital Reserve Fund, established for the financing of construction, reconstruction, and public betterment (majority hand vote required). Motion was made M/S/P.
- Article 6: Motion was made by Sharon DeVries to amend a misprint of the Rye Beach Village Proposed Budget to read: 2000 Budget, 2001 Actual, 2002 Proposed. Motion was M/S/P.

Motion was then made to accept the proposed total expenditures of \$89,100.00 for the ensuing year. Motion was M/S/P.

Article 7: To authorize the District Officers to raise money by District note in anticipation of taxes. Motion as M/S/P.

Article 8: To see if the District will vote to authorize the Commissioners to apply for, receive and expend Federal and State grants which may become available during the course of the year, in accordance with RSA31:95-b, and also to accept and expend any money from any other governmental unit or private source to be used for purposes for which the District may legally appropriate money. Motion was M/S/P.

Article 9: To transact such other business as may legally come before said meeting.

A note from Jerry Gittlein was read to the board expressing concern that the sidewalk repair for the westerly end of South Road was to be addressed this year. Betty Smith reported that after a study that repair and monies had been allocated for this project.

Brad Richards thanked Sharon DeVries for her many years and countless hours of work she graciously gave to the Rye Beach Precinct.

Linda Smith asked all Rye Beach residents to report any vandalized or failed lighting to them for repair.

The community expressed concern about a growing number of thefts in the Rye Beach Precinct. Please report all suspicious activities immediately to the police. There being no further business the meeting was adjourned at 8:15 pm.




